inside the tower entrance.

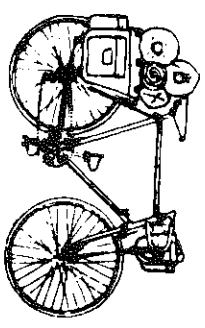
Because cross country skiing is fun, easy,

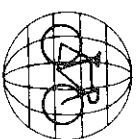

MEETING PLACE: Scott McLain reported that the Club was given permission to use classroom 2006 at KVCC for the next four months to hold the Business Meeting.

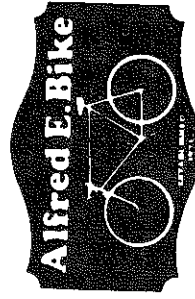
