Shorter Bike Lanes Downtown Kalamazoo

Major changes coming for the bike lanes in downtown Kalamazoo. As Paul Sotherland states "If we truly are headed toward removing the cycle track on Michigan Ave east of Rose AND creating safe/comfortable routes for cyclists to ride their bikes to locations close to City Center, park their bikes, and then walk to destinations, then let's encourage the City to make those changes <u>now</u>." Doing so would require some planning, paint, and sufficient signage. And, ten to one says doing that now would help shift the narrative about the downtown reconfiguration away from "...those damn bike lanes..." to something akin to "Streets For All."


