

Minutes of the September 17, 1978 Meeting

TREASURER'S REPORT Fall Century: Phil reported that the Fall Century attracted about 125 riders. With the help of donations of time, effort and gas, the Club only lost \$9 in spite of the low turn out. The loss was at least partially caused by the printing cost of 3600 copies of the publicity flyer which were printed to hand out at the Covvention. Volunteers made the ride possible. Dave Hageman and Scott McLain painted the arrows and warnings and Dave donated the cost of the paint. Frank Desposato and John Byrne drove saguagons and Marlene and Marion Hoyer provided the staffing at the Scotts Mill checkpoint. Kevin Kimbrough worked the registration desk. Finally, thanks go to Sandy Kimbrough for coordinating all of this. Club Treasury: Phil reported that the balance in the Club is now \$249 out of which we still owe the racers their insurance refund of \$65 and the State of Michigan a \$10 filing fee. The estimated cost of printing and mailing of the remaining of this years newsletters is \$100 which should leave us a balance of at at least \$50 in January. Clarification: The membership form at the end of this newsletter is NOT a renewal form. The fees on that form reflect the prorated fee for the rest of this year as well as next year. Convention Souvenirs: Phil reported that we still have about 200 T-shirts from the Convention as well as about 300 patches and 200 of the map sets. He suggested that the T-shirts and patches could be sold by mail through an ad in the LAW <u>Bulletin</u> and, if corrected, the map sets could be sold locally. Ad space begins at \$50. After discussion it was finally agreed that Phil should explore the pssibilities of selling the T—shirts through the local bicycle shops when he distributes the October Newslatter. It was agreed that, with Phil's guarantee that the Club would not experience a loss, we should place an ad in the December LAW Bulletin selling our patches for \$1 plus 25¢ handling charge. Phil also agreed to bring the Club estimates of the costs of redoing the maps so that the Club could, if it chooses, try to sell the map sets through the local shops.






