



#### MINUTES OF THE APRIL 17th MEETING

Jini called the meeting to order.

FOUR LAKES Jini asked for volunteers to help work registration so that no one would end up working all day. She also asked for help distributing posters for the event. Some were found for both. Club members interested in helping on the day of the ride should ask at the registration table if additional help is needed. There will be an additional ride the day following for those who help at regisistration or drive sag. Others are invited to join that ride. For the time at which the sagwagon ride will begin on Sunday, check at the registration table.

SVRS-IV Pat florian reported the progress of the preparations for the first day of racing and asked for volunteers to undertake some last minute tasks. Arrangements were made for volunteers to show up on the day of the race with brooms to do some last minute touch up sweeping.

"Tour de France" film Pat Florian announced that the Battle Creek Club would be showing the film on April 18.

Pat Also announced that the MSU Cycling Club would be holding a stage race on May 6 and 7.

Pat also wanted feedback on whether it would be feasible to earn additional revenues at the races by selling T-shirts with an SVRS Logo.

ESCAPE 178 Debbie Dinda reported that there were 176 people registered for the convention (now there are over 230). It was also reported that the person in charge of publicity, Rick Bauer, is back in the hospital for additional surgery on his hand. The Club extends its best wishes to Rick and hopes to see him out sprinting on the Kalamazoo roads soon.

REPORT OF THE ROAD CAPTAIN Kevin Kimbrough reported that we have been attracting some young riders who do not always ride safely. He suggested that ride leaders should remember that they have the right and the responsibility to inform riders how to ride safely on the road and also to insist that they do so.

TREASURER'S REPORT The club balance is now \$277.52. Except for additional revenue from new club members and the uncertain revenue from FOUR LAKES and the fall century and possibly \$40 more in advertising, these funds must enable us to produce eight more newsletters and hopefully the revised version of the County Map, the mileage patch program and the advance expenses of the fall century. The newsletter (the PEDAL PRESS) is presently costing us \$20 a month for printing and \$20 to \$30 for postage. We have no outstanding debts and the insurance has been paid. Compared to last year, this is an optimistic report. A turnout at FOUR LAKES similar to last year would put us in very good shape for the rest of the year. THE TREASURER ASKS YOU TO RIDE.


