

Minutes of the Kalamazoo Bicycle Club Meeting of July 17, 1978

TREASURER'S REPORT: Phil reported that the Club had assets of \$57. (With additional memberships brought to the meeting by Debbie Dinda and LAW patch revenues, the balance was \$98.96 as of July 24th.) The publicity for the Distance Medley and the Fall Century has already been mailed, so these monies plus the revenues from the Distance Medley must finance the printing and mailing of the August and September newsletters, the maps for the two rides and any sag services that these two rides require. The treasurer also reported that only very preliminary estimates of the income of the Convention are available. At this time, it appears as if we may have netted around \$200 total on the Convention and pre— and post—tours. A full report will be submitted after all of the bills are in.

FALL CENTURY: Jini reminded those in attendance that Scott McLain and Dave Hageman have agreed to paint the Fall Century route arrows, but that a Committee is needed to check the route, change ihe map if desirable, and seek and organize sagwagon volunteers. Sandy Kimbrough, Frank Desposato and Jan McLain agreed to have the route decisions made by August 16th so that Dave and Scott could have sufficient time to paint the route. Jini agreed to get the flyers to shops.

ESCAPE'78: Jini reported that the comments obtained from nonclub members indicate that the Convention appears to have been an artistic success. Sandy also reported that the pre-aand post-tours were fun.

BIKE-A-THONS: Jini reminded those at the meeting that we have previously agreed to helo the Chicken Coop people to stage a Muscular Dystrophy ride. (Club members will remember that the Chicken Coop furnished weekly awards for the Spring Valley Road Series IV.) She indicated that she would meet with them to get further details. Jini also reported that the local chapter of the Michigan Lung Association (MLA) is interested in obtaining our help to stage a bike-a-thon which would be held either this fall or next spring. Jini indicated that the basic requirements would be a ride with access to bathrooms, checkpoints to validate miles ridden by participants and available refreshments. The MLA has indicated that they would take care of publicity while the Club would plan the ride and staff it. Discussion ensued. It was indicated that other Clubs which have staged such rides have received a small share of the ride fees. General willingness to cooperate was indicated but the discussion revealed questions about insurance for the ride, and the financial return for the Club. Debbie moved that the Club helped stage the bike-a-thon next spring if the answers to the financial questions are satisfactory. Richard seconded the motion and it was passed. Jini was instructed to obtain additional information and report at the next meeting. Debbie Dinda, Kevin Kimbrough and Phil Caruso volunteered to help staff the bike-a-thon.

The meeting was adjourned Respectfully submitted
