

## SUMMARY OF KBC MEETING OCTOBER 15, 1979

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Club balance is \$397.45 in addition to the monies from ESCAFE '78. This is an unusually large amount for this time of year. No explanation is available.

MEETING PLACE: The issue of an alternative place for the Club meeting was discussed. Phil reported that the YMCA charges \$20 per evening. Phil asked how people would react to meeting at Western Michigan University. Three people indicated strong disapproval. Scott McLain agreed to contact the Portage Public Library and Phil agreed to contact the local shopping centers and the banks.

OFFICERS: Phil announced again that the Club needs volunteers to take over the offices. As of this newsletter we have the following volunteers: Ed Shankman (Newsletter Editor), Debra Dinda (Road Captain), Scott McLain (Vice-President), and Rick Bauch (Race Captain). One person has offered to take the treasurer position if the secretary part of the office is separated from it. At this point we need: a president and a secretary-treasurer. Phil pointed out that an alternative is for the current active members to meet at Lexington Green School every Thursday and arrange rides and not have a formal Club. Are there any volunteers???

CALENDAR OF EVENTS: Sandy Kimbrough reported that we need to begin developing the schedule of events for next year. She suggested August 11th for the Distance Medley and August 30th for the Fall Century. August 30th is the Saturday of the Labor Day weekend so the ride would not qualify for National Century Month and the Club would be unable to provide such patches. Moving the ride to the first weekend in September might result in conflicts with other rides. (For the last few years, Maple Leaf Century has been staged on that Saturday and the Hancock Horizontal Hundred is on that Sunday). After discussion those present voted to choose September 6th rather than August 30th. Sandy suggested that we stage a weekend ride thru Wine Country on July 12 and 13th. She suggested that we think about a ride to Milwaukee via the ferry as an alternative to the Hell to Paradise ride. The other two events the Club staged last year were Four Lakes and the Lung-a-thon. Since Jini was absent it was agreed that Jini be asked about the Lung-a-thon and that we put the tentative dates for the above events in the newsletter for feedback and vote on the schedule at the November meeting.

CHRISTMAS PARTY: The Christmas Party will be held on December 17th in place of the regular meeting. Debbie reported that her apartment complex has a place which the Club could rent for \$30 and a deposit of \$200. It was agreed to delay this decision until after the decision about the regular meeting place had been made.

CLUB T-SHIRTS: Richard Dinda displayed a T-shirt with a bicycle scene silk-screened on it. He reported that a firm in Michigan is willing to develop a silk screen of any scene the Club wants for \$30. The Club could buy T-shirts and paint and silk-screen shirts for members. It was agreed that the silk-screen design should include the name of the Club. Members who wish to, should submit disigns for consideration at the November meeting and the designs be placed in the December newsletter and voted on at the December meeting.

KATS: Phil said he had not contacted the Kalamazoo Area Transportation group to speak with them about the bike path proposal on which they are working. Sandy Kimbrough volunteered to contact them.

RACE COMMITTEE: Pat Florian reported on the Race Club meeting. Rick Bauer has agreed to be treasurer and race captain. Kevin Kimbrough has agreed to work on staging a roller race series with nearby Clubs and a race at Spring Valley. Pat said the Club is seriously looking for a coach this year.
