SUMMARY OF KBC MEETING MAY 21, 1979:

In the absence of the President, Vice-President Dave Hageman conducted the meeting. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$460.50. Sandy Kimbrough reported on FOUR LAKES: Revenues of \$270.84, expenses, \$225.84, net profit, \$45.00. Sandy also recommended another starting point as Oakland is in very bad condition. Jini Caruso reported on the BIKE-A-THON for June 2 with the American Lung Association. Volunteers were sought and obtained. The local bike shops have agreed to each contribute to a "prize kitty" so bike related prizes can be offered. The meeting voted to sell Escape '78 T-shirts at the Bike-a-Thon June 2.

Jini Caruso presented the data Phil Caruso had obtained concerning the costs and benefits of not distributing the newsletter to the shops. None of the shops which advertise in the newsletter objected to the idea of not distributing newsletters in the shops. Two pointed out we would then need some other way to make people aware of us. Phil's data suggested that if we typed up a separate ride schedule and a membership form to distribute to the shops we would save about \$1.00 a month over current costs. If we made posters, someone would have to make them and update the 6 each month. On the basis of the cost data the meeting voted to continue placing the newsletters in the shops.

Under New Business, Kevin Kimbrough suggested the club consider some clincs for new riders on shifting and comfortable riding. Kevin and Jini Caruso offered to do two clinics in June before the Thursday night rides. Topics will include shifting and saddle height. We also discussed developing some new rides and ride leaders. Debbie Dinda and Jini Caruso agreed to develop some ideas and offer a clinic on Planning Rides.

The Executive Committee after the meeting agreed to revise and reprint the "Invitation to Ride" and new member handouts. A new member handout "On Leading Rides" was also OK'd. Those plus a current copy of the Constitution should be to all members by June 10.
