#### SUMMARY OF KBC MEETING JULY 9, 1979:

Treasurer reported \$204.26 balance.

Sandy Kimbrough reported she would call people to recruit workers for the Distance Medley Bicycle Tour, August 12. Sandy then reported briefly on Coastline '79, the National Convention of Bicyclists. The riding was mostly city and suburban. "Country" as we know it simply wasn't nearby. Sandy's complete report is elsewhere in the Newsletter. Both Sandy and Kevin reported on activities the club might consider for safety and legislation. One project, developing a slide show on hazardous conditions for bicyclists on the roads and bike routes around Kalamazoo, Phil Caruso and Kevin will start on right away. The convention report generated some discussion about safety and legislation and education. Kevin offered to head a revived Safety-Education Legislation Committee. Phil Caruso reported the club had been asked it it had an official position on bikeways, and had to report no. The executive committee was instructed to write up a resolution incorporating that the club felt wider roads and paved shoulders were the best way to go rather than grade separated bicycle routes.

It was voted to treat the net revenues of the convention ESCAPE '78 as restricted funds for education and safety particularly until a report and procedure for spending the moneies can be developed. The convention report is elsewhere in the newsletter. Jini Caruso was appointed to collect the ideas of members for spending the \$1,617.22. We then adjourned to watch the film "Bikeways for Better Living" which included an ad for 30 second spots on safety and education which went on Jini's list.

#### AUGUST THURSDAY NIGHT RIDE SCHEDULE:


