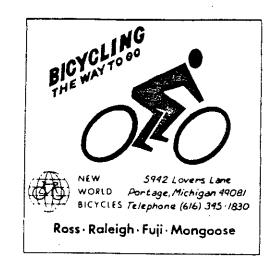

MINUTES

Treasurer's Report: Jan McLain reported that the current balance in the checking account was \$183.04. In addition, preliminary estimates suggested that we netted about \$54 on the Spring Into Shape Ride. On that ride, expenses were \$54 and we had 54 riders for a total of \$107 in ride revenues.

SPRING INTO SHAPE: As reported above, we attracted 54 riders. Considering the weather was cold and with some forecasts of rain and the conflict with the CROP walk, we were pleased with the turnout. Elsewhere in this newsletter is a report from John Hart with the information about all of the people who worked on the ride. FROM THE CLUB: Thanks for organizing the race, John. Without someone to volunteer to lead the rest of the volunteers are worthless. It was a job well done.

OVERNIGHT WEEKEND: Scot McLain reported that he is still trying to work out plans for an overnight weekend ride.

WMU Bicycle Club: Members of the WMU Bicycle Club attended the meeting and reported that their Club had its first meeting just before the end of the Winter Semester.

CITIZEN'S RACE Scot McLain asked whether the Club thought that there was time to organize a Citizen's Race for this year and whether there were enough volunteers to stage such a race.
