STANDING CLUB RIDES

The following rides will be occurring regularly.

Beginning this month ride leaders will be asked to get signatures of ride participants on a release form. We have been advised to do this to protect the club from liability. Ride leaders are instructed to not provide a map to anyone who refuses to sign the release form.

TIME TRIALS: Every Tuesday evening at 7:00 there will be a ten mile time trial at 7:00 from just past the railroad tracks in Augusta. Riders should arrive earlier if they wish to warmup. Call Sandy Kimbrough for more information.

TRAINING RIDE: Every Sunday Paul Visich will stage a training ride of about 40 to 60 miles from Spring Valley Park at at the Water Tower on Mt. Olivet. After trying this for April and May, Paul wishes to make some modifications by dividing the ride up into two groups as follows:

Group A: Faster pace, averaging about 20 miles per

hour with a distance of 50 to 75 miles.

Group B: slower pace, but still designed to be a training ride. Average speed will be 15 to 18 miles per hour and the distance will be 30 to 50 miles.

Group B will be leaving one half hour before group A. All rides will start from the upper parking lot of Spring Valley Park. If you are not sure which group to ride with start with group B. You can always jump in with group A when they go by. Group A will leave at 2:00 and B will leave at 1:30. Call Paul at 349-3147 to make sure the ride is on or for further information.

PACELINE WORK: Every Saturday at 12:00 Dan Ferrara will lead a ride of about 20 to 40 miles starting from the parking lot of Kalamazoo Central High School. The intent of this ride is to practice riding in a paceline and speed is less important. Call Dan at 382-3200 for additional information.
