POPULARITY OF BICYCLING In a recent <u>Wall Street Journal</u> article there was a report on leisure activities and their popularity, the results should be interesting to bicyclists. On the basis of their sample of adults 18 years and older, the participation rate in bicycling has grown from nonexistent in 1959 to 17% in 1966 and to 31% in 1985. Only two activities where more popular in 1985: Swimming at 41% and Fishing at 32%. The participation rate in running/jogging was only 23%.
