KBC JERSEYS In the last newsletter there was a call for those who were interested in purchasing a KBC jersey. Unfortunately, only five members expressed interest where 25 were needed to meet a minimum order so we will not be able to place an order. Sorry to those five members.

BE SEEN While it probably doesn't pay to be obscene on your bike, it definitely is a very good idea to be seen, especially when riding early in the morning or late at night. Several options are available to maximize your visibility to motorists. "Belt Beacons" are small flashers which can be attached to saddle, belt, etc. and are highly visible. A closeout on last year's model makes them available for \$9.95 from Ampec & Associates, Inc., Arcadia Station, Box 15461, Phoenix, Arizona 85060.

"Sidelights" are small stick-on reflectors for your bike or accessories. The microprism reflective technology was developed by the Coast Guard. For a dealer write: Custom Wheelights, Inc., Box 100156, Fort Worth, TX 76185. A similar product is "Hot Spot," available from many running shops. The very highly reflective tape is extremely visible in minimal lighting conditions.

# Ride Classification

- A+ 17+ mph, few rest stops, hard rides for the experienced tourist and training racer.
- A 15-17 mph, occasional rest stop, designed for the experienced tourist.
  - B 13-14 mph, frequent rest stops, intended for the average tourist.
- C 11-12 mph, frequent rest stops, intended for the developing tourist.
- D under 10 mph, less than 15 miles, relaxed pace, frequent rest stops to keep group together, for developing riders and riding families.
- Z long (over 50 miles) ride to be ridden at the rider's own pace without on-the road ride leader supervision.
