Area Bike Shops Support the Kalamazoo Bike Club

We in the Kalamazoo Bike Club are lucky to have the support of a number of bicycle shops in the greater Kalamazoo area. The proprietors of these shops support the KBC with their time, their advice, and their dollars. Anyone who has ever worked at a bike shop [as this editor has] knows that there's never an overabundance of funding. The financial support the shops provide to the Club comes at a high cost to such low-markup businesses.

Listed below (in alphabetical order) are the shops that provide support to the KBC.

Alfred E. Bike, established in 1972, is a long-time supporter of the KBC. Over the years, Alfred E. has sponsored many Club activities and has volunteered mechanical expertise to help on larger Club rides. Currently, Alfred E. is a sponsor of the KBC Racing Team.
