2. Learn Bike Maintenance

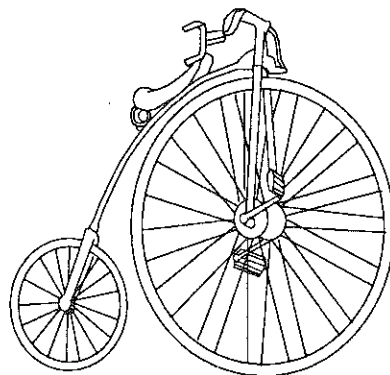

Recurring Rides

Mondays

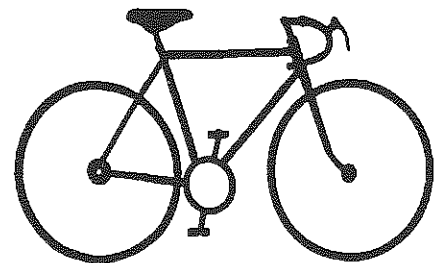
