The Wine Country Cruise. From Kalamazoo Valley Community College for a brisk, refreshing trip through prime vineyard country. Dave "Dirk" DeRight (381-2678) leads (or hangs on to) the lead group, while Bill "Miguel" Watt and others lead a slower group. Routes vary from flat to rolling, 15-30 miles or so.

Wednesdays

The Drake Road Double. Its "two rides- two rides- two rides in one." Usually splits in to two groups, with the faster group riding "the loop" while another group rides an interesting route. setit down, and examined my surroundings. This was evidently a center of operations. There were tracks and conveyers leading through various tunnels, and there were crude offices set up.

That's where I found this terminal. The mine, like everything else these days, is run by computers. This one has an operating system I'm familiar with, and it was fairly easy to get an outside link to access the main computer at Bikopoulis Imports. I brought up my diary file and began typing.

This, you understand, will be my last entry. I heard the satchel charge go off a few minutes ago. It had to be done in order to seal the mine shaft and contain the blast. It also leaves me with a problem. That was the only elevator. When the Bomb detonates in thirtynine, make that thirty-eight minutes, Spike Bike will be no more.

Men like me are, I suppose, an inevitable consequence of harsh times. But when the times change, we are out of place in the World.
