November KBC Meeting



Ride Incentive Program for 1993–A Proposal

The following is a proposal to the membership of KBC to revive the ride incentive program that was used and very poular with club members during the 1990 and 1991 seasons. If you have any comments, please write the club at P.O. Box 527, Kalamazoo, MI 49005.

1993 KBC Ride Incentive Program

General Description:

The Ride Incentive Program keeps track of KBC members' yearly KBC mileage and presents awards to high-mileage riders.

Purpose:

This program is designed to increase KBC weekly ridership.

General Rules:

- 1. The program runs from January 1, 1994 until November 30, 1994.
- You get credit for KBC rides and invitational tours (e.g., the Cereal CIty Century).
- 3. Club members are responsible for making sure their milage gets on ride rosters and gets sent in from invitational tours.
- 4. At least 75% of the mileage must come from KBC rides.
- The Ride Incentive Program Coordinator will be responsible for record keeping and reporting, and will decide all questions of the rules of the program.

What Club Ride Mileage Qualifies?

- 1. Club rides must be listed in the newsletter or put on the ride line at least three days before the ride takes place.
- 2. Mileage credit is given for riding to and from the event, by the most direct route.

What YOU have to do:

- 1. Sign the ride roster at each Club ride you attend.
- 2. For each invitational tour you do, send in your name, the name of the event, and how many miles you rode.
- 3. Verify your mileage in the Pedal Press every month.
