

President's State of the Kalamazoo Bike Club Address

As the new year rolls in, it looks like 1994 will be an eventful period for the Kalamazoo Bike Club. The new board of directors is in place and our agenda for the year is going to emphasize one item: riding your bike. To maximize the riding opportunities within the club, we are going to concentrate on developing a solid ride calendar that offers a good variety, and we are going to work on building the membership base. These are two areas that we believe have not received as much attention as they should in the last few years.

To develop a strong ride calendar, we are going to consistently schedule the same rides throughout the riding season if at all possible. We are also going to try to resurrect a few rides that proved popular in years past (like the Ice Cream Ride), and we are also going to develop a few new ones - maybe a weekend "ride-to-breakfast." In an effort to accommodate mountain bike riders, we will be establishing a weekend mountain bike ride, most likely at Ft. Custer. We will also schedule between three and five special event club rides, like the "Tour-de-Doughnut," throughout the year.

Increasing our membership base is a major priority. There are at least fifty to sixty active road riders in the area, the majority former KBC members, who should be brought back into the club. And with the growth in mountain biking the potential to attract new members has never been greater. If we can successfully increase the membership, the quality of club activities should improve immensely. The success of these efforts will depend a great deal on your cooperation and efforts. Please read the accompanying article related to our membership drive and have a role in helping improve the club.

You should also be aware that the board has decided to keep the KBC membership dues structure the same as last year. The intention behind setting the membership fees is that the fees primarily cover the cost of your newsletters, which each month includes the

cost for printing, labels and postage. I think you will agree that the membership dues are very reasonable and offer a great return on your investment.

The club also incurs numerous other expenses that need to be taken care of throughout the year, such as a phone bill each month for our ride line and rental of our post office box. Did you know that we have to purchase liability insurance for our club rides? We also pay dues to support other cycling organizations like the League of American Wheelman, the United States Cycling Federation and the National Off-Road Bicycling Association. To cover these costs, KBC relies on the profits from the special events we promote each year which includes the Flowerfest Tour, the USCF road race and Corporate Olympics. A new fund raiser that holds a lot of potential is the Ft. Custer mountain bike race. These events are crucial to the club's prosperity and growth, and the success of these activities relies on the membership.

This brings us to the last issue I want to address: volunteering to help within the club. We can not be successful without help from our members. Please consider volunteering when you read one of the regular appeals for help that appear in the newsletter. It's a great way to meet new friends, while making a significant contribution to the club. If you have volunteered in the past year, I want to thank you and I urge you to continue to help and to encourage others to get involved.

In closing, let me say again that 1994 will be a great year for the Kalamazoo Bike Club, with several changes and improvements throughout the year. And we won't loose sight of the club's main objective: riding our bikes.

The Trailway Gathering Do You Have Vision to Share?

Correspondence to KBC from the River Partners Program:

Help Create a Recreational Trailway from Allegan to Battle Creek

We see a corridor of opportunity stretching some 40-50 miles from Battle Creek to Allegan. The trail twists along the waters and cities by the revived Kalamazoo River, occasionally spanning off through woods, inactive railroad right-of-ways, utility corridors, existing public parks, and passes close to urban centers to offer shopping and refreshments. The trailway holds more than recreational and social possibilities for its patrons; environmental educational opportunities abound and adjacent businesses benefit from the passing tourists.

A route has not been selected for the envisioned Trailway. The final route will be selected through an extensive public involvement process. To date possibilities for the Kalamazoo River Valley corridor of opportunity have been considered including inactive railroad rights-of-way, utility corridors, existing public parks and easement across private property.






