Return of the Tuesday Time Trial?

Your trusty *Newsletter* editors, Kathy Barrett and Doug Kirk are thinking of bringing back the Tuesday Night Time Trial next summer.

For those of you with short memories, Tuesday night used to be *the* night for a relatively short, flat ten mile time trial.

For a number of years, the course was on M-96, just east of Augusta. The out-and-back course went five miles east, toward the Battle Creek airport, and back again.

Eventually people decided this route had too many cars, so the course was moved to Climax, with a similar length course going south then back north.

But the whole thing died out when the key to the whole thing, a truly wonderful woman from the Battle Creek Bike Club named Sandy who did the timing, finally gave it up.

We have a course in mind a bit closer to Kalamazoo. We think that 36th Street going south from Scotts would work just fine. It's exactly five miles from QR Ave. to VW Ave., and the road's reasonably wide with decent pavement. VW Ave., where the turn-around would be, is a dirt road with very little traffic.

Like all out-and-back courses, there it the problem of having to turn around, but one U-turn seems like a better idea than four left- or right-turns.

Proposal: Enlarge Bicycle Club Executive Board to Include Two At-large Board Positions

The KBC Constitution currently provides for an Executive Board to handle the club's business. The Board consists of the following five officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Race Team Director. These officers all have duties consistent with their titles. Given that each current officer already has a set of duties (i.e., Treasurer keeps track of the club's money) it was suggested at the club's general membership meeting on November 10 that the Board be expanded. The reason expressed for this expansion was that the new Board members would not have a set of previously defined duties and could thus be available to take charge of special interest issues such as bicycle advocacy.

Specifically, in accord with Article X, Section 6 of the KBC Constitution, John Mathesion made a motion to amend the Constitution to create two at-large Executive Board positions. After some discussion, the five members of the current Executive Board unanimously voted to approve this amendment. Again, in accordance with Article X, Section 6 of the club's Constitution, this proposed amendment must now be brought before the general membership for a vote. This vote will occur at the membership meeting to be held on January 18, 1997. Please come out and cast your ballot.

Proposed Amendment Language:

ARTICLE V Elections Section V-A and V-C:

1. Section V-A.

Add the phrase Two At-large Members before the "and Race Team Director".

2. Section V-C.

Change the second sentence to read as follows:

The offices of Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, <u>Board Members At-large</u> and Race Team Director are elected annually.

3. ARTICLE VI, Officers and Duties

Add the following language after the paragraph Race Team Director:

Board Members At-large

- 1. Are voting members of the Executive Board.
- 2. Are responsible for assisting the other Board members with their duties and taking on specific projects as the need arises.

A meeting is being planned to get input from interested folks (LIKE US) concerning routes, destinations, and specific needs for given areas or interest groups.


As we go to press, the location has not been determined, but December 12, 1996 has been selected as the date, probably at 6:30 or 7:00 p.m. at one of the local schools.
