Better Biking in Two Acts

Happy New Year! We say it even though we know it won't all be happy. Or even pleasant. In fact, some of us aren't happy unless we're intentionally pursuing something difficult. We seek out something hard in order to test ourselves, to overcome the obstacle. Nonetheless, KBC wants to provide as many happy opportunities for you to ride your bike as we can. And we want those rides to give you what you want and need in a group riding experience.

(Act I)

To that end we published a group ride survey to gain some insight into how our current offerings are doing to help our members. We explicitly asked those who don't participate in group rides to answer the survey and gave them a separate set of questions to ascertain how we might adjust our rides to meet their needs. I was gratified that about 50 people answered the survey! Thank you for participating!

As a quick reminder, from March to October KBC sponsors the following weekly rides:

Monday night from Texas Drive Park

Tuesday evening PoWeR women's ride from Celery Flats in Portage

Wednesday night ride from the Kal Haven Trailhead on 10th St.

Friday Morning Ladies Ride from Texas Drive Park

And then once a year rides including W Avenue (April), Anniversary Celebration Ride (May), Kal-Tour (June), Ride to South Haven (August), we encourage members to participate in Fall Bike Celebration (September) and the Fall Foliage in the Forest (October).

We are still working through a mountain of data you provided but look for a summary and recommendations to come out in the next couple of months. KBC will update and improve our group riding in 2023.

(Act II)

<u>Street Fight!</u> This provocative phrase is the title of a book we have been reading together. It details efforts made in New York City to make streets safer for all users, including walkers and bike riders.

President: John Knowlton

John opened the meeting at 7:00 PM and announced that KBC will try out a new venue for our monthly meeting. On January 10, 2023, we will meet at the <u>Oshtemo Community Center</u> at 6407 Parkview Avenue, Kalamazoo 49009 to see if this venue is a better fit for our group.

In response to member comments about the pop-up bike lanes on Westnedge and Park, we asked Doug Kirk to follow up with traffic engineer Dennis Randolph about the metrics regarding the City's plan for these lanes. Dennis responded that the lanes will continue be in use for at least a full year while the City collects additional data for further evaluation.

KBC sent out a survey regarding group rides and received 59 responses. A complete summary of the survey will be shared at a later date, but the responses indicate an appetite for a greater variety of rides, routes, and times of rides.

DIRECTORS REPORTS:

Education Chair: Paul Wells

The Education Committee is proposing a scaled-down version of Bike Camp for 2023 by reducing the time commitment and price, while supplementing the experience with high quality educational videos and mentorship by experienced KBC Ride Leaders. Mentorship and guidance will continue to be offered at the Monday Night Ride and perhaps other Club rides. No final decisions have been made and the committee is open to feedback and suggestions.

Gordy asked about LCI training. Paul noted that the League of American Bicyclists will hold an LCI training course tentatively in

August 2023. LCI training is for those who want to become bicycle educators. They are also planning a Smart Cycling class in March 2023, which is a prerequisite for LCI training.

Doug noted that bike fit and education in bike function are both critical elements to Bike Camp.

John Knowlton proposed that we consider offering Bike Camp free of charge. Several other members agreed that free or nominal cost is worthy of consideration.

He is also coordinating the 2023 Anniversary Party, which, like Bike Camp, is considering May 20th as a possible date. The EC will continue to discuss KBC's 2023 calendar so that Bike Camp and the Anniversary Party complement each other.

Secretary: Teri Olbrot

Teri noted that ModeShift Kalamazoo has donated a bike rack to a new grab-and-go coffee shop and eatery in Texas Township, the Round About Caffe. She encouraged everyone to check out the coffee shop and bike rack, which is across the street from Wedel's on the corner of Texas Drive and 12th Street.

New Business:

Membership suggests that KBC write a congratulatory letter to the City of Kalamazoo, Christina and Dennis in particular, to thank them for their hard work efforts on behalf of bicyclists and consider them for our Friends of Bicycling Award.
